

## Summary of winners for Excalibur Award for 2007

### Active Component - MTF:

Resource Management, Martin Army Community Hospital (MACH), Fort Benning GA

Nomination title: Business Process Re-engineering (BPR), Leveraging Technology

Martin Army Community Hospital's Business Process Reengineering (BPR) team leveraged technology to produce three highly automated software analysis tools that directly contributed in a dramatic and sustained increase in access compliance from 83% to 97% and their sustainment of a 21% increase in RVUs from 2005.

### Active Component, Non - MTF:

US Army Graduate Program in Anesthesia Nursing Center for Graduate Military healthcare Education, Academy of Health Sciences, Fort Sam Houston, TX

Nomination title: The US Army Graduate Program in Anesthesia Nursing - Today's Anesthesia Training for Tomorrow's Fight

The USAGPAN now efficiently and proficiently educates and trains Army CRNAs according to Global War on Terrorism lessons learned in preparation for deployments. The increased matriculation will dramatically improve the inventory of a critically short wartime essential specialty with savings in tuition and potentially long term savings by decreasing costly contract CRNAs.

### Reserve Component - TDA:

Nomination title: Soldier Readiness: Health Improvement Promotion Program

The CAARNG's Health Improvement Promotion Program is a multi-disciplinary program designed to be sustainable, inexpensive and easily reproducible at the unit level. Where implemented, HIPP increases unit readiness, improves soldier deployability, and results in major reductions. This program can be used Army-wide to improve soldier readiness for deployment.
