



DOD Medical Interagency Satellite Training (MIST)

What's MIST all about? An initiative called Medical Interagency Satellite Training (MIST) has been fully funded by the Veterans Health Administration and DOD Joint Incentive Fund Program which supports joint initiatives in the medical field. The goal of this program is to significantly improve the amount and quality of training available to the healthcare community—without having to leave your facility. In addition, many of the institutions that provide content will award CME and CEU credits after you have viewed their broadcasts. Check the schedule for this availability.

What kinds of programs are available? We work with a subcommittee of the DOD Health Education Council to identify programs that will be of benefit to you. You may contact us if you know of other programs that we can rebroadcast. Programs are co-sponsored for GETN subscribers by the program originators and the DOD MIST Program Office located at Wright-Patterson AFB, near Dayton, OH. Programs are on the front of this flyer.

Receiving Programming

Programming can be received through any site belonging to the Government Education & Training Network (GETN). There are over 2,200 of them world-wide.

- If you are at a major Air Force installation in CONUS, Hawaii, or Alaska, you have a downlink at your medical facility—contact your Medical Education & Training Officer ([see http://detn.govdl.org/page.cfm?page=6](http://detn.govdl.org/page.cfm?page=6))
- If you have access to GETN **within** DOD, please go to your local site coordinator, ([see http://detn.govdl.org/page.cfm?page=6](http://detn.govdl.org/page.cfm?page=6)) who will schedule the site, subject to availability.
- If you have access to GETN **outside** DOD contact http://getn.govdl.org/GETN_POCs_Restricted.htm for a list of all agency contacts. These POCs will assist you in contacting the personnel managing your site of choice for program viewing, subject to availability.

 If you have access only to the **Army's TNET, Distance Learning DTF, or Classroom XXI**, you should still be able to receive the program. Contact your local [VTT Site](#) for registration, and ensure your site coordinator registers you for the program you desire at the DETN [registration site](#).

 If you have access to the **Navy Learning Network**, you should be able to receive the program. Contact your local VTT for registration, and ensure your site coordinator registers you for the program you desire at the DETN [registration site](#).

Purpose Statement

Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD) is one of the major disorders seen in veteran patients by VHA/DoD clinicians. With the new clinical practice guidelines for CKD, there is a knowledge gap in key areas related to the management of patients with CKD. This knowledge based activity is directed towards various professional groups caring for patients with chronic kidney disease, including physicians, nurses, pharmacists, and dietitians. The purpose of the broadcast is to introduce primary care team members to the VA/DoD Clinical Practice Guideline for the Management of Chronic Kidney Disease in Primary Care; identify implications of the guideline for VA and DoD patient populations; and describe how to integrate the use of the guideline into primary care practice.

Target Audience

VHA/DoD physicians, nurses, pharmacists, and dieticians involved in the care of patients with chronic kidney disease.

Outcome/Objectives

At the conclusion of this educational program, learners will be able to:

1. Identify key elements of the VA/DoD CKD practice guideline.
2. Discuss implications of the VA/DoD CKD practice guideline for the DoD's population.
3. Discuss implications of the VA/DoD CKD practice guideline for the VA's population.
4. Describe how to integrate use of the VA/DoD CKD practice guideline into primary care provider and team daily practice.
5. Identify appropriate pharmaceutical issues that are unique for the patient with CKD.
